

Participant Agreement - Make COP26 Count Programme

Background

As Hope for the Future, , Christians for Creation Care and Christian Concern for One World, we are excited to be able to offer this programme. This participant agreement form aims to give a comprehensive understanding of what is involved in participating, and to ensure expectations are clear between all parties to facilitate the most positive experience possible.

Our hope is that participant churches will reach COP26 with a real sense of achievement and ownership having acted to raise national and international ambition for climate justice.

Participants will benefit from dedicated support provided by Hope for the Future, Christians for Creation Care and Christian Concern for One World

- For spiritual action
 - Monthly virtual meet-ups with other participants and global partners *AND*
 - Participant platform to share knowledge, but also to communicate and pray *AND*
 - Resources and guidance to host a [Climate Sunday](#) event
- For their chosen practical action e.g.
 - Working towards Eco Church accreditation (or a similar scheme) *OR*
 - Using energy footprint tools to completing an Energy Audit of your church and create a plan to reduce emissions to Net Zero by 2030 *OR*
 - Run an energy switch day event (moving energy providers to renewable energy)
- For their chosen political action e.g.
 - Meeting your MP
 - A tailored lobbying strategy with lots of specific information about your MP and their position on climate change, prepared by Hope for the Future's experienced researchers
 - Support to contact your MP's office and arrange an online meeting
 - Training with Hope for the Future on getting the best from MP meetings when you want to talk about climate change
 - Holding a virtual panel event with your MP
 - Holding an MP school workshop

What we ask of participants is that they:

- Be prepared to learn
- Be prepared to attend
 - Monthly virtual meet-ups
 - Two interactive political training sessions run by Hope for the Future
 - A meeting with your MP
- Be prepared to contribute
 - By being an active user of the participant platform

- By being the point of contact between this programme and your wider church or Christian community
- By hosting a Climate Sunday event
- By choosing and implementing one of the suggested practical actions new to them
- By being responsible for organising actions e.g. after the political training you will need to send the meeting request letter which is prepared, and work with Hope for the Future and representatives from your church to plan an agenda for the MP meeting
- To feedback surveys during the project so that we can learn from and improve this programme
- To sharing stories from the programme with Hope for the Future so that can be used in outreach work

Practical Arrangements

We want this programme to be a genuine shared experience across churches, while also providing the support to those leading within their own congregations and taking on some of the additional preparatory work.

To this end we ask for a lead contact with primary responsibility for the above, as well as the names of 2 or 3 additional named people from within the church congregation or community who can confirm they understand what their church partaking in this programme entails, and who agree to assist and accompany the lead contact in taking action.

We ask that at least one person named is part of the formal leadership team within the church, and strongly encourage the involvement of young people.

The lead contact will be expected to attend the monthly meet-ups, other named contacts are also very welcome to attend.
